ADVISORY FOCUS

During the month of November, our Advisory groups enjoyed some healthy competition by playing Kahoot and having a Rock, Paper, Scissors tournament. We talked about what healthy competition means and focused on building relationships and supporting one another, while having fun!

Students then discussed GRATITUDE in their small groups, shared what they were grateful for, and then brainstormed ways to show gratitude to others. Each group is working on a poster or display to demonstrate how they will be grateful and show gratitude going forward. This is timely with the Thanksgiving holiday at the end of November.

The topics of Advisory will continue to be based on the needs that arise across all three middle schools in town. It is important to provide an opportunity for students to talk with one another and with a familiar adult as they process information and make sense of their world.

TRIMESTER 1--->TRIMESTER 2

The last day of Trimester 1 is on Monday, December 5th and the first day of Trimester 2 will be on Tuesday, December 6th. Students will rotate to their second Unified Arts trimester class (Art, Computer Science, STEM) on Tuesday.

Once the trimester ends, teachers will be finalizing grades and adding comments for students. Trimester 1 report cards will be available in Aspen on Wednesday, December 15th by the end of the day.

Students and parents should make sure they have access to their Aspen accounts so that report cards can be accessed. Please reach out to Mr. Procacini (procacinim@fraknlinps.net) for support with your accounts.

As we transition to the next trimester, which means we have two thirds of the school year remaining, the teachers will appropriately increase expectations. Students should be continuing their learning outside of the school day by studying, reviewing concepts, completing homework and projects, etc. The FPS Homework Policy suggests students work independently, outside of school, on homework for 60 minutes per day. We encourage parents to communicate with teachers if their child is working for longer than this amount of time.

This year, our students will lead conferences on two half days in March (March 8th and March 9th). Students and parents will attend a portion of one of the days to review work and engage in a conversation about their learning.

FRANKLIN POLICE TOY DRIVE


The Franklin Police Department hosts a Toy Drive every year. There are a few different ways to participate:
