Attendance Matters!

As we continue to move beyond the years of schooling heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, we are still seeing impacts on student attendance that are difficult to resolve without family support. If you receive an email or letter from school administration about attendance concerns, please know we want to partner with you to resolve issues as a first step. We regularly monitor attendance, but given the significant number of students who are approaching chronic absenteeism this year, your efforts at home tend to have a larger impact than we can facilitate on our own.

When you receive communication from us, please keep in mind that we are <u>following MA state</u> <u>guidance</u> about what constitutes chronic absenteeism, as outlined in our handbook: "Massachusetts defines **Chronically Absent** as missing at least 10% of days enrolled (e.g., 18 days absent if enrolled for 180) regardless of whether the absences are considered excused, unexcused and/or for

disciplinary reasons. Being chronically absent can have a significant impact on a student's ability to read at grade level, perform academically, and graduate on time."

Regardless of the reason for absences or tardies, we will be communicating with families with this metric in mind. To support our efforts to improve attendance, please reach to Ms. Ramos to let her know the reason for the absence or tardy. Please be sure to read the health reminder from our school nurse related to this.

Health Reminder from Mrs. Daly

As we enter the cold and flu season, we are asking for your collaboration in helping to ensure we keep our schools, students, and staff healthy and safe. As per Franklin Public Schools policy, please remember and adhere to the following protocols:

Keep your child home from school if:

- your child has a fever of 100 degrees or higher
- your child is vomiting or has diarrhea
- your child has a contagious illness such as flu, strep throat, chicken pox, COVID, etc. If unsure, please contact the school nurse for guidance
- your child's eye is pink, red, or itchy, and/or a crusty drainage from the eye is present
- your child has tested positive on a rapid antigen or PCR test for COVID and/or awaiting results of COVID testing (all positive COVID test results should be reported to school nurse for return to school guidance/masking protocol upon return)

Students may return to school when:

- fever-free for 24 hours without the aid of fever-reducing medicines
- 24 hours after the start of antibiotic therapy for a bacterial infection
- 24 hours without vomiting or diarrhea

We are committed to maintaining the health and wellness of our students and staff. Thank you for your help, and as always, please contact the Health Office with any additional questions and or concerns that you may have.
