Advisory Focus

During the month of February, Advisory groups started off the month focusing on thoughts, feelings, and emotions. The sixth grade groups worked to describe how strong emotions can influence the decisions they make. The seventh grade groups worked to distinguish helpful thoughts from unhelpful thoughts and the impact unhelpful thoughts can affect decisions they make. The eighth grade groups worked to reframe certain types of stress as opportunities for growth. All groups used the Second Step curriculum to support the direct instruction of these important skills and concepts.

Prior to vacation, the Advisory groups participated in team building activities and focused on recognizing Black History Month by looking at various heroes, including Langston Hughes, Katherine G. Johnson, and Wynton Marsalis.

STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES (March 8 and March 9)

This year, our students will lead conferences on two half days in March (March 8th and March 9th). Students and parents will attend a portion of one of the days to review work and engage in a conversation about their learning.

Students will be dismissed on these days at 10:45am and then the conferences will take place from 11:30am-2:10pm. Families should plan to return to ASMS about 5 minutes prior to their allotted time. All adults will need to obtain a visitor badge by scanning a driver's license in the main office.

The focus of Student-Led Conferences is for students to lead a conversation with their families to take ownership of their learning and to reflect on the growth they have demonstrated during the second trimester. They gathered artifcats and evidence from their classes and will be discussing their work. Teachers will be supporting the students, but the conversations will be driven by the students.
