# May Update Annie Sullivan Middle School 

## Advisory Focus

During the month of April, advisories spent much of the month working through the final unit of our SEL curriculum, Second Step. The focus of this unit is on managing relationships and social conflicts. Throughout the unit, students learned strategies for
 developing and maintaining healthy relationships, perspective-taking, and dealing with conflict. Additionally, on days that grade levels completed MCAS testing, advisories took a break from Second Step and had an opportunity to engage in either mindfulness activities to settle the brain or a movement activity to energize the brain and body.

Throughout the month of May, students will start the month by finishing up the final Second Step unit. We will also have another presentation from our nurses about taking care of yourself, including getting enough sleep and protecting your skin. The Advisory committee is busy planning a variety of different learning opportunities for the last two months of school.

## FPS Comprehensive School Facilities Planning



As previously shared, Comprehensive School Facilities subcommittee has presented a plan to continue to provide highquality education opportunities for our students while creating a more fiscally sustainable model for our district.

The options presented will result in two strategic changes for the 2025-2026 school year:

1. Unifying our three middle schools into one middle school in one location, the current Horace Mann/Oak Street complex. This will result in the closure of the three middle schools as they currently exist.
2. Unifying our five elementary schools into four elementary schools in two locations, the current Remington/Jefferson Complex and the current Annie Sullivan/Helen Keller Complex. This will result in the closure of the five elementary schools as they currently exist and the redistricting of all students between these complexes. As a result, the Kennedy and Parmenter Elementary Schools would become unoccupied in their current capacity.

School Committee Members will vote on a final recommendation at the next School Committee meeting on May 14, 2024. A vote to take action on this option will result in strategic master planning during the 2024-25 school year, followed by implementation for the 2025-26 school year.

## Health Office：Postural Screenings

Franklin Public School nurses will be conducting postural screening on all students in grades 5－9 this spring per Massachusetts law（M．G．L．c．71，s．57）．The purpose is to detect early signs of possible spinal problems in children．It is not a diagnostic service but a program to identify those who should have further medical evaluation．If your child has any unusual findings，you will be notified and asked to take the child to a physician．The majority of students exhibit no findings．If nothing unusual is found，we will not be contacting you again until the screening next year．

School Nurses are required to perform these screenings annually regardless of whether or not a child has been screened by their provider．Parents may choose to opt－out of their child＇s school screening by providing a written statement（M．G．L．c71，s57）by May 10th．If choosing to opt your child out of the school screening，please forward a copy of your child＇s most recent postural （scoliosis）screening to your child＇s school nurse．

If you would prefer your student not be screened for scoliosis at school this year，please complete this Google Form．
