## Chromebook Registration and Insurance

All Franklin Public School middle and high school students will have a Chromebook assigned to them.

Parents/Guardians of seventh and eighth grade students will need to register the Chromebooks as soon as possible using this <u>link</u>. Once the device is registered, the Chromebook will be activated for another year of school. If the Chromebook registration is not filled out, the Chromebook will be disabled on August 27th and will only be reactivated once the device has been successfully registered (within 24 hours). The devices (and chargers) should be brought to school daily.

Sixth grade and new students to ASMS will receive a Chromebook and charger on the first day of school. These devices will be active and families will have the first week of school to register the Chromebooks.

During the registration process you will have the opportunity to purchase OPTIONAL Chromebook insurance for the year. The Franklin Public Schools Chromebook optional insurance program provides coverage against accidental damage (drops, spills, etc.). There is no deductible and no limit to the number of claims that can be made for a Chromebook. Insurance can be purchased only via online payment and only during the open enrollment window, beginning now through October 15, 2022. This form must be completed for each device your child/children may have.

**Coverage Option** - The cost for coverage is \$45 per year, per device with lower rates for those who qualify for free/reduced meals. Coverage includes Accidental Damage from cracked screens and liquid spills, liquid submersion, fire, flood damage, vandalism, natural disasters, and power surge due to lightning.

**NOT COVERED:** Intentional damage, case carvings, broken chargers, will not be covered. Additionally, if a device is lost or stolen (as determined by our insurance provider), families may be responsible for the total cost of the device. Please note that full loss due to theft is only covered when accompanied by a police report.

**Note**: While the insurance is OPTIONAL, those choosing NOT to insure devices will be responsible for the full replacement cost of \$250.00 should an accident or loss occur. Full replacement cost will be the only option available and partial costs to repair a damaged Chromebook will not be considered regardless of the damage as we do not repair these devices in-house.

#### Flex Intervention Block

Across all three middle schools, we have a Flex (Intervention) block towards the end of the day. It is the second to last period for sixth grade and is the last period for seventh and eighth grade.

Flex period is an intervention block during the school day that allows students the opportunity to participate in a number of different experiences outside of the Flex classroom setting (academic support, social pragmatic lessons, band, chorus, orchestra, counseling, etc.).

The students who remain in the Flex class because of no other commitments during that time, will have a meaningful experience as well. The culture of the individual Flex period are being developed at the start of the school year with clear expectations and options for students. Flex expectations, schedule, and routines are created as a team within the guidelines established as a middle level.

Teachers are establishing a schedule to include time for literacy (reading, journaling, book groups), independent work time (to complete homework assignments), team-building activities, organization, etc. The expectations and structure of Flex has changed from year to year, and this year the expectations are a little different. Students will not be able to complete independent assignments every day, but rather every other day. It is important for students to create structures and systems at home in order to learn independently and make progress towards mastery of the curriculum. We understand this is a shift and will require some flexibility and patience as we adapt to new expectations.

Regular and frequent communication is helpful between parents/guardians, teachers, and students. We understand the busy lives of our students and are here to help provide resources and supports to navigate this change.

At the middle level, students should be spending about 60 minutes per night on independent assignments. This may fluctuate as classes do not meet every day in the 14 day rotation. If students are spending more than one hour on homework assignments each night, please be in communication with the team of teachers.
