- d. Summary of trip purpose/educational alignment: Explore Your Estuary- Build your own Bay curriculum by combining a range of programs for a unique ship-to-shore or coastal-lab experience. This customized field experience program allows you to blend coastal and shipboard programs with land-based programs at our Providence Bay Center. This program allows you to choose up to two land-based or lab activities and combine them with a one-hour boat excursion aboard M/V Elizabeth Morris, M/V Alletta Morris, or M/V Rosemary Quinn.
