Re: Adjustment to April Vacation
I am recommending that the Franklin School Committee vote to amend the 2019-2020 school year calendar to eliminate 4 days of April vacation (April 21-24, 2020). Students will participate and faculty/staff will lead Remote Learning on these 4 days. Monday, April 20 is a state holiday

As you know, the second phase of Remote Learning began on Monday, April 6. A vacation beginning on April 21 would disrupt momentum and routine that this plan sought to create. Continuing with remote learning will allow for continuity of instruction and maintenance of important SEL connections during the extended closure due to COVID-19, which has been a very disrupted period of time.

Commissioner Jeff Riley issued a statement on Friday, April 3 deferring to local decision makers on any potential changes to April vacation/school calendar. According to his statement, "if a school district continues providing its remote learning program for students from April 21 to 24 , the district is not required to go beyond its previously scheduled $181^{\text {st }}$ day."

Eliminating April vacation would put the end date of the Franklin Public Schools school year as Thursday, June 18 (our 181st day, as we had one snow day in December 2019).

I consulted with the district's leadership team and the Franklin Educators Association in coming to this recommendation. Additionally, faculty/staff and families were surveyed. The results of the survey were overwhelmingly in favor of eliminating April vacation. $93 \%$ of faculty/staff ( $\mathrm{N}=610$ ) and $89.3 \%$ of families $(\mathrm{N}=2400)$ favor eliminating the break. Options were provided to eliminate all four days or eliminate three days, thereby providing two long weekends. Both groups favored eliminating the break entirely with the following percentages: $63.8 \%$ of faculty /staff and $65.5 \%$ of families.

Those who wished to keep April vacation suggested that face to face content days at the end of the year would be more valuable. Additionally, some families and staff expressed feelings of being overwhelmed at this time. We are happy to do what we can to support families and staff who are struggling at this time.
