

Our Process

- DESE, Portrait of A Graduate, DEI, and SEL lens were used to make sure our offerings were in line with our core values and academic expectations
- Adjustments were proposed & reviewed by FHS and FPS administration
- Approved Adjustments are being presented to FPS School Committee
- FHS students will begin course selection process

Highlighted Adjustments

Increasing Graduation Requirements:

- Students in the class of 2028 and beyond must take the Personal Finance class in any semester of any year to meet this graduation requirement.
- Students in the class of 2028 and beyond must complete 20 hours of community service over the course of four years to meet this graduation requirement.

Senior Experience Externship:

The Senior Experience allows students to engage in an academic, professional, and/or personal experience during 6 weeks of an unpaid externship that may ultimately shape the course of their future. Students will utilize critical thinking skills and increase their awareness of how to pursue a career, community service/outreach project, or artistic path of interest. Students will attend several informational meetings during the first three quarters in preparation for finalizing an externship by March 1st. During the month of March, students will meet with the Senior Project advisors to go over their goals for their externship.


