#### Remote Setting

- Was a good baseline for hybrid setting.
- Teachers took great advantage of getting used to virtual learning.
- Many teachers began to explore different types of programs and virtual tools for the classroom.
- Despite the difficulty of the year, there are many positives that came from the virtual experience and the discovery of new educational tools is one of them.

#### Hybrid Setting

- Teachers were well prepared for the virtual setting and now made adjustments as a portion of the class was back in session.
- Teachers and students did an amazing job staying connected to the class when they were experiencing being in school for a portion of the time and remote for a portion of the time.
- The remote preparation at the beginning of the year made this process a little easier as teachers had experienced students in the remote setting and were able to adapt their teaching to meet the needs of all students.

#### Full In-person setting

- Still maintaining strong connections with students who selected to remain remote.
- There is certainly a new energy in the building, students are excited to be back!
- Teachers have made another adjustment to their instructional model and are using their class time with a focus on appropriate in-person strategies.
- Remote students are staying connected as if in class, our students are interacting in class and with those remote students.
- Many have said that to maintain the remote connection while we are back full in-person they treat the computer like a student.
- Although this has been ongoing all year, having most students back full in-person allows us more ways to connect with students to support an SEL Focus.
