Open Questions

- 1. Will we have to pivot to remote learning for any period of time in one or more schools due to a cluster of cases or staffing challenges due to quarantine restrictions?
- 2. As we approach the end of the year, how can we continue to hold our traditional events but modify and do so in a healthy and safe way? What can we do to keep our remote only students included in these activities?
- 3. What can we learn in the last few months of school in order to plan for a successful 2021-2022 school year? What should we put into place now to carry into the following school year?

Teaching and Learning

In accordance with federal and state requirements, MCAS testing is underway at FHS this week with grades 3-8 to follow. Students test in ELA and Math in grades 3-8 and 10. Additionally, students test in science in grades 5, 8, and HS Biology. In light of the pandemic, high school graduation requirements for MCAS have been adjusted for the class of 2021 and 2022. All MCAS testing will be concluded by mid-June. Juniors aiming to earn the Seal of Biliteracy may opt into the ELA MCAS testing.

Advanced Placement (AP) tests have begun at FHS with 611 students participating in 24 subject area tests. Results come in over the summer. Good luck to all of our hard working students. FHS is in the Top 10 schools in the state as far as #'s of AP exams we administer! This includes private and public schools.

NWEA assessments will be given at the elementary level during the week of June 7. We are repeating the assessments given in March for grades K-3 to identify areas of strengths and challenges for the district. This will provide needed data so that we will be able to more effectively aid students in meeting academic expectations. Some schools will also be piloting the Reading and/or Math assessments in other grades in June. We believe that the experience with NWEA this year will inform our work in this area in grades K-8 next year so that we can administer assessments, make informed decisions about instruction, progress monitor, and assess growth.

Other

The Elementary and Secondary Education Emergency Relief (ESSER) round II application will be completed in the next few weeks with funds anticipated to be used in FY22 for instructional interventionists, permanent building substitutes, and counseling services.

ESSER III guidance and allocations are due to be released next week. We anticipate an allocation of approximately $$1.1\ M.$
