Davis Thayer Update

We have contracted with a demography consultant who will be engaging in a projection of enrollment across the entire district, inclusive of Davis Thayer as well as all elementary and middle districts and Franklin High School. We will be receiving a report and a presentation to forecast to 2030. We anticipate that this work will be complete in January.

We are in the process of working with the Facilities Department to develop a project scope and seek proposals related to facility study of Davis Thayer and a functional capacity study of all other buildings.

Professional Development Day Preview -- November 5, 2019

The following topics will be addressed at the Full Day Professional Development Day on Tuesday November 5:

- Jane Hardin will return to the District and work on effective inclusion practices with elementary classroom and special education staff. They will apply their learning from the morning session with actionable outcomes at each building. Some areas of focus include planning prioritized units of study with differentiation, development of tiered accommodations within current units, and incorporating formative and summative assessment data to meet students' needs.
- Middle school educators will be meeting by departments in the morning to focus on content specific development. They will apply their learning from the October 11 Jane Hardin workshop by co-planning differentiated instruction among classroom teachers and special educators.

- 3. Franklin High School educators will be meeting by departments in the morning to focus on content specific development. They will be furthering their understanding about development of cultural proficiency in the afternoon.
- 4. Nurses will be in a workshop on helping students with anxiety. In the afternoon, they will be collaborating with the Franklin Police Department related to Narcotics.
