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Superintendent's Report to School Committee March 21, 2023

MASS Legislative Breakfast

The Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents (TriCounty Districts) hosted Legislative Breakfast on March 3, 2023, School Superintendents were joined by School Committees Chairs and Legislative Representatives to learn about the successes and challenges facing school districts and to ask for their continued support related to the 14% tuition increase to out of district special education schools, circuit breaker reimbursement threshold. Some of these topics will be discussed later as budgetary drivers in our presentation.

Redistricting Information

As we continue to update the community regarding the redistricting analysis process this year to help us identify the short and long-term needs of the District.

- Redistricting Analysis Advisory Committee has met monthly since November with AppGeo to workshop scenarios to present to the community.
- A district working group represented by School Committee, the District has met with AppGeo to process feedback, refine the recommendations, and structure the redistricting analysis process, which is outlined into six stages.
- Last week we conducted the public input stage, consisting of several public forums to present three proposed scenarios refined by the Redistricting Advisory Committee for review.
 - March 7th, 2023 in-person
 - March 13th, 2023 virtually
 - March 15th, 2023, virtually for all elementary and secondary staff

Our Space Needs and Facilities Subcommittee met last night and is in the process of reviewing the information to arrive at a recommendation for the school committee's consideration and vote in April.

Thank you to our RAAC and working group members for their participation and input. We anticipate the April timeframe to finalize the recommendation.
