Update on Athletic Fans

I want to confirm that we are actively investigating the matter. Tonight, I want to thank community members who reached out with leads and additional information. It takes every member of the community to foster a safe, welcoming, and inclusive environment for everyone – residents and visitors alike – and we truly appreciate the cooperation. As the investigation is still underway, I am not going to comment further on it. We will issue an update to the community later this week.

A few weeks ago, during the Superintendent's Report, I lauded our Student Services Leadership and ESL Leadership for their contributions to the DESE Tiered Focused Monitoring Review.

As background, the Office of Public School Monitoring visits each district and charter school every three years to monitor compliance with federal and state special education and civil rights regulations. DESE also visits to monitor compliance with ESL regulations.

We are pleased to share that we had NO FINDINGS in the area of special education. The program and department met all of the standards of DESE.
