## **February Meeting Highlights**

In our February meeting, Superintendent Giguere provided an in-depth pre-budget season overview of the **FY25 Budget**. This presentation, accessible <u>here</u>, not only dove into the financial landscape, but also discussed its implications for students. Superintendent Giguere presented four distinct budget models, emphasizing the District's priorities and obligations.

Jennifer Knight-Levine, CEO/Co-Founder of **SAFE Coalition**, was a guest speaker. SAFE is a non-profit organization that focuses on mental health and substance recovery. Jennifer took the time to shed light on SAFE's impactful Substance Use Diversion program, emphasizing its crucial role in addressing youth substance abuse and risky behavior. Approval was granted to the FHS Science and History departments for two exciting **2025 international trips:** Costa Rica and Southern Italy. These journeys offer students a unique opportunity to explore different cultures and create lasting memories, fostering a global perspective.

March marks our return to the regular two monthly **School Committee meetings**, scheduled for **March 5th** & **March 19th** at **7 PM** in the Town Hall Council Chambers. These meetings are open to the public for both in-person and virtual attendance to foster community engagement. Budget Season is officially underway! Superintendent Giguere shared his recommended FY25 budget to the School Committee on March 5th. The **Superintent's Recommended FY25 Budget** presentation can be found <u>here</u>. The **Joint Budget Subcommittee** meeting followed on March 6th. This collaborative effort between the Town Finance Committee, Town Council, and the School Committee Budget Subcommittee spans multiple meetings in the coming weeks to discuss and prioritize the needs of the town, determining how they will be funded. The School Committee meeting on **March 19th** will dive deeper into budget-related discussions. The public is encouraged to attend and contribute their input regarding needs to consider as part of the budget process.

The **Comprehensive Facilities Assessment** is entering its final phase with the compiled data set to be presented to the School Committee. This information will be instrumental in making informed decisions about the future of FPS, emphasizing transparency and data-driven choices.

Students, ranging from rookies to seasoned performers in their sixth year of Jazz, showcased their passion and dedication.

The Remmington, Horace Mann, and Annie Sullivan Jazz Bands performed two songs each, setting the stage for performances from two FHS Jazz Combos, the FHS 3 Day Jazz Band, and FHS Monday Night Jazz Band. The night crescendoed with a collaborative performance of **"Beantown Blues Parade"** uniting all bands in a lively performance. Students paraded around the cafeteria on sousaphone and auxiliary percussion with two sections of improvisation to represent a New Orleans party in the streets.
