Suburban Superintendent's Conference Recap

I am returning from the Suburban Superintendent's Conference, held at the end of last week. The theme of the conference was "Leadership and The Arts: The Power of Arts in the Lives of Leaders to Nourish Creative Thinking and Transform How We Approach the Work of Leaders". In four sessions, we heard from speakers who discussed the following topics:

 Teacher and Musician Jen Chapin, daughter of Harry Chapin, engaged us in a musical performance to demonstrate the power of music in how we think, feel, and engage with each other.

- Dr. Jay Noreika, interviewed Ms. Chapin. He also delivered a keynote address from his position as an ocular surgeon and writer to examine the role of art for leaders.
- Lodge McCammon, author and educational consultant, engage the group in an exploration of how he uses music and dance to enhance lessons within the classroom.
- We learned from Caroline Woolard, a sculptor based out of New York. She engaged us in hands-on, practical ways in which we can use art in our work as leaders with our leadership teams.
- Lastly, we had a workshop with Erin Charles, a musical conductor and professor from Vanderbilt University. She demonstrated compelling data from her research related to addressing the underrepresentation of students of color in music programs.

It was a very valuable event in that I was also able to network with colleagues and learn from them about the initiatives in their district as well as some online tools they are using to engage with their communities.
