TRANSPORTATION OPDATE

The transportation department has been preparing for the 2018-2019 upcoming school year. Consistent with Mass General Law. the School Committee policy affords students in kindergarten through grade 6 who live over 2 miles from their

district school to ride at no cost. Students K-6 within the 2 mile range and all students in grades 7 through 12 have the opportunity to "Pay-to-Ride". The cost remains at \$325 per student with a cap of \$975 per family.
