In October, the Community Relations Subcommittee of the Franklin School Committee hosted parents/guardians and their children to learn more about the complexities of social media. Over 70 attendees learned from a panel of presenters including licensed mental health counselor, Amy Leone; Franklin High School Principal, Paul Peri; Massachusetts Partnership for Youth Representative, Bob Ferullo; and Franklin Police Department

Our second parent/guardian information night took place on November 19. Dr. Judith Owens, Director of the Center for Pediatric Sleep Disorders and Professor of Neurology at Harvard Medical School, engaged the audience in a presentation on the biology of sleep and the dangers



of sleep deprivation. She also spoke about considerations for schools related to start times, homework, and sleep education. She provided parents/guardian with some practical advice, as well, about the influence they can have at home in promoting a healthy sleep environment and in discussing the dangers of sleep deprivation, including drowsy driving.
