What is a Buddy Family?

Each Buddy will be paired with a Buddy Family. There will be five members to this family.

- 1. **Buddy** student with an intellectual or developmental disability
- 2. Peer Buddy Buddy's one-to-one match who is responsible for getting together with their Buddy at least once a month outside of school.
- 3. Letter Buddy responsible for sending some sort of written communication to their Buddy at least once a week.
- **4.** Lunch Buddy responsible for sitting with their Buddy at lunch at least once a week.
- 5. Recess Buddy responsible for playing with their Buddy at least once a week at recess.

All of the Buddy Family members will be invited to monthly meetings. Most of those monthly meetings will include fun activities that are completed with their Buddy. Three times during the year, the Buddy Family members will meet with staff without their Buddy in order to help initiate and maintain the relationships that are being created as well as continue to foster the inclusive environment that already exists at Keller Elementary.
