## PURPOSE

- + To align current homework practices in the district with the School Committee Policy
- + STUDY CURRENT RESEARCH AND IDENTIFY BEST PRACTICES
- + Examine our beliefs about homework
- + IDENTIFY CURRENT PRACTICES IN FRANKLIN
- + CREATE HOMEWORK GUIDELINES THAT ALIGN WITH THE POLICY

## PROBLEM: INCONSISTENT PRACTICES

- School Committee and Central Office Administrators conducted surveys and focus groups for parents and teachers
- RESULTS: FRANKLIN HAD A WIDE VARIETY OF HOMEWORK PRACTICES AND EXPECTATIONS
- SCHOOL COMMITTEE ADOPTED NEW POLICY

# PLANNED OUTCOMES

FORMATION OF A HOMEWORK STUDY GROUP IN FALL 2017 WITH THE GOAL OF PRODUCING A SET OF COMPREHENSIVE HOMEWORK GUIDELINES THAT:

- Represents current research and best practices in the field
- ALIGNS WITH THE FPS SCHOOL COMMITTEE POLICY
- Addresses the need for consistency across the district
- Are easily understood by students, teachers, and families
  - CAN BE IMPLEMENTED IN THE FALL OF 2019

# STUDY GROUP PROCESS

- Read, researched, studied
  - O THOROUGH EXAMINATION OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE POLICY WITH ITS EMPHASIS ON THE WHOLE CHILD
  - Examination of our own beliefs
- Defined what success would look like for the Study Group?

# STUDY GROUP PROCESS

- Studied and researched best practices regarding homework (Fall 2017)
- EXAMINED CURRENT PRACTICES IN FRANKLIN VIA TEACHER SURVEY (SEPT. 2018)
- ESSENTIAL QUESTION: "How will we communicate our new learning and understandings regarding homework to create closer alignment between current practices and school committee policy?"

# STUDY GROUP PROCESS

- Identified as a committee what homework guidelines could/should look like- content and format (Oct 2018)
  - O DID NOT RECREATE THE WHEEL LOOKED TO OTHER DISTRICTS
  - Identified what was a best fit for Franklin
  - O CONSIDERED RESEARCH, COLLECTED DATA TO INFORM DECISION-MAKING
- Began drafting sections in small groups (Nov-Dec 2018)
- FINALIZED PROPOSED GUIDELINES IN JANUARY 2019

# History and Why We Did This Work

#### **End of 1800s**:

little homework assigned due to lack of consistent attendance

#### <u>1900 -1950</u>:

progressive movement lead to low homework assigned fresh air was a key focus

#### Late 60s and early 70s:

anti homework thoughts resurface - lower pressure on students

#### Late 90s and early 2000s:

back to low homework due to *family* time and Whole Child

#### 2000's-2020:

The Pendulum is split! Varying views, opinions, and beliefs!

#### 1950s:

competition with the Soviet
Union (Sputnik!) caused a
spike in homework assigning
- "We need to be prepared for
the future!"

#### <u>80s - 90s</u>:

"A Nation at Risk" published and the pendulum swings back - economic success is being tied to academic success



- Definition of homework
- Purpose(s) of homework
- Amount of time should take a student in each grade
  - O GUIDE FOR FAMILIES AND TEACHERS
- DEVELOPMENTAL AND SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL NEEDS OF STUDENTS
- FAMILY/STUDENT WORK-LIFE BALANCE
- Research-based best practices for homework
- FRANKLIN-CENTRIC

# PROPOSED GUIDELINES- LINK

- Defines homework and its purposes
- EXPLAINS THE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR ALL: STUDENTS, TEACHERS,
   FAMILIES, AND ADMINISTRATORS
- EMPHASIZES IMPORTANCE OF NIGHTLY READING AND MATH FACT FLUENCY AS FOUNDATIONS FOR ONGOING LEARNING
- Provides recommendations by grade level for average time to be spent on homework
  - RECOMMENDS CONTINUING HOMEWORK FREE VACATIONS

# HOMEWORK FREE VACATIONS

- PILOTING AGAIN THIS YEAR AND CONDUCTING SURVEYS TO GATHER FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS, TEACHERS, AND FAMILIES
- Overwhelming support to continue this K-8
- SIGNIFICANT SUPPORT FOR FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL CONTINUATION
  - To the extent possible for February and April"

# FEEDBACK NEEDED

- THE CURRENT PROPOSAL OF FPS HOMEWORK GUIDELINES
   WILL BE OPEN FOR FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS,
   TEACHERS, AND FAMILIES
- WE NEED TO HEAR FROM ALL STAKEHOLDERS
- A <u>SURVEY</u> WILL BE ADMINISTERED FOR EACH GROUP

# NEXT STEPS

- Make any necessary adjustments to proposed guidelines
- Include in handbooks for Summer 2019 with implementation in 2019–2020
- MONITOR NEXT YEAR, VIA SURVEY TO DETERMINE
   EFFICACY OF IMPLEMENTATION
